## NE Ohio Regional Office's excellence leads to bigger jobs

The Northeast Ohio Regional Office's exceptional growth has not gone unnoticed by trade publications such



as Crain's Cleveland Business. Its local revenue has grown 163.5% from 2020 to 2021 and significant sustained growth is expected when 2022's final numbers are calculated.

There are many reasons for the regional office's success but being a multi-discipline trades contractor that can do it all is tops among them, said Regional Vice President Dave Boyer.

RLG has completed some large-scale projects in the last few years, including projects such as the Ultium Cells facility in Lordstown and the Carvana Inspection Center in Elyria Township. But many projects start out as smaller jobs that lead to more work, such as with Artiflex, Charter Steel and Lincoln Electric.



RLG's success at earlier projects convinced M&M Industries to select it to build an extension to its Lordstown facility.

"Customers often hire us to perform one specific job but will ask that trade whether we can handle different types of work," Boyer said. "Our trades workers understand the capabilities of our other trades. They tell the customer, 'You know, our company can do that as well.' This support often leads to long-term customer relationships."

Groups within the office work closely with one another, share knowledge, cross train new employees so they understand the company value propositions, and make introductions when the timing is right to key individuals.

RLG installed the initial production line for M&M Industries, a plastics extruder which

manufactures pails for the food and other industries at its Lordstown plant. This initial project led to additional equipment installs in 2021 and an expanded process cooling system in 2022. When M&M needed a warehouse addition, it didn't have to look far. RLG won the contract for the 78,675-square-foot addition including site work, concrete and a new preengineered metal building connected to the existing building.

Ground was broken for the addition in November with completion set for fall of this year.

Knowing and understanding all RLG's capabilities leads to successful projects, value to the customer, and continued growth for RLG.

**Chelsea, Michigan --** The Southeast Michigan office and GEM Site Management will team up to install electrical equipment at Stellantis' Chelsea Proving Grounds.

GEM will install three 8.3KV substations and new switches in a new powerhouse building to power 50 electric vehicle chargers of various sizes. It will also selfperform concrete, masonry and HVAC work. The site is where Stellantis does all of its EPA, regulatory and R&D testing. The chargers support being able to do the testing on its EVs.
