Safety Flash

Incident with Recordable Injury

Date of Incident: 9/30/2019

The Incident

As an associate was unloading weld lead from a truck when a splinter entered his left index finger underneath the fingernail, resulting in an OSHA recordable.

The Causes

- Lack of PPE: The associate was not wearing his gloves, which were in another fleet vehicle.
- Lack of Planning: The weld lead was not palletized for unloading at the customer location. The unloading was coordinated to be performed by a tow motor operator provided by the customer.

Prevent It

- Pre-task planning needs to cover all aspects of the job, including pre-mobilization, loading and unloading.
- Check and correct your peers if they are not doing the right thing.
- Pay closer attention and take your time when transporting, loading and unloading equipment, tools and materials.

Action Plan

- A custom stand-down for STAC/pre-task planning will be created and conducted in the field.
- A fleet vehicle safety kit will be built to provide all fleet vehicles with PPE, a first-aid kit, fire
 extinguisher, tie downs, foreman binder, etc. The Safety Committee will evaluate what the kit
 should contain and present ideas for implementation.
