

Safety Flash

Incident with Recordable Injury

Date of Incident: 11/8/2018

The Incident

An associate was grinding welds when a piece of slag came loose from the weld, ricocheted off the wall and went under his safety glasses into his eye, causing a scratched cornea.

The Causes

- The grinder's rpm was too high for the wire wheel.
- The work was performed in a corner, which allowed the slag to ricochet off the wall.
- His safety glasses were not the spoggle style, which would have provided an additional layer of protection.

Prevent It

- Consider using a hand-held wire brush instead of a grinder.
- When grinding, use spoggles instead of regular style safety glasses.
- If a grinder must be used, choose a lower rpm grinder.

Action Plan

- Use a hand held wire brush in place of a grinder when practical.
- If a grinder must be used, wear full PPE, including a face shield and spoggles. Also, use a low rpm grinder.
